**Exams** There will be four (4) [Exams], and a comprehensive [Final Exam]. There will be **no make-up exams**. The requirements are **Scantron 886E and TI-83-TI-84+** calculator for all exams. Late students will be considered absent and will not be permitted to take the exam. The door will be locked at 11:10am. Note: there are practice exams for each chapter on the website.

**Quizzes** There will be 7 quizzes. You may use your own notes and homework problems on the daily quizzes. Your own notes include any website notes on problems, any re-written class-work examples, and any notes taken from the textbook. No electronic devices will be permitted during exams or quizzes. Calculators only. Note: The number and frequency of the daily quizzes may vary.

**Labs** There will be **two (2)** lab assignments (**L#1 and L#2**); **each one is due the same lab period, no exceptions. Come to the lab prepared to print your results. Check your on campus access to the computers and printers. THIS MUST BE DONE BEFORE THE FIRST LAB!!!!**

**Homework** Assignments have been made **online** at **MATH ZONE**. Students are responsible for the completion of **all** assigned problems on a daily basis. An access code to the Math Zone website accompanies a new textbook. If you purchase a used text access to Math Zone must be purchased separately. Proceed to the website and purchase an access code. The due dates posted on the website are your final access to the homework problems. Check the due dates frequently. In addition, there will be selective **textbook** problems assigned.

**Class Participation:** Under Title 5 California Administrative Code, Section 58004: A student may be dropped if no longer participating in the course. "No longer participating includes but is not limited to excessive absences."  
Participation is defined as

- **Arrive on time to class and stay the entire class period.**
- **Complete all assignments.**
- **Bring all of the materials necessary for that class.**
- **Contribute to group activities including but not limited to online work.**
- **Take all assigned quizzes and exams.**
- **Contribute to class discussions.**

*Participation does not relate to the grade you are getting, however, it can affect the final grade that you get.*

**Note:** Students are expected to attend all sessions of the classes in which they are enrolled. Students are expected to be prompt and not leave early. Classes will begin on the hour. Attendance will be taken at each meeting. Students leaving early or coming in late will be docked 0.5 day. **Students with more than 3 unexcused absences can be dropped from the course.** Two late/early days = 1 full day. If withdrawing from the course it is the student's responsibility to withdraw. Report all absences by leaving a message on my email or my office phone message system **prior** to the absence.

**Calculators/Lab** The TI-83/TI-83+ is required. No Other Calculator Will Be Acceptable. Bring your calculator every day!! Failure to have a calculator for class work or exams will result in a zero. Sharing of calculators is not permitted. No exceptions. The micro-computer lab is located in Room 611. You may use any open lab at any time during its scheduled hours (see hours posted on Lab 901, as well as , the lab located in the 500 building). **Place money on your student account immediately to allow you printing privileges at any lab on campus where students have access. This may be done at the bookstore.**

**Tutors** There is tutoring available on the website associated with your textbook: **MATH ZONE**. There are also practice problems and practice exams on the website. **Use it!!** Campus tutoring is available in Student Services from staff tutors. ## FULLERTON COLLEGE MATHEMATICS DIVISION SELECTED COLLEGE POLICIES

### ACADEMIC HONESTY POLICY

Students are expected to abide by ethical standards in preparing and presenting material which demonstrates their level of knowledge and which is used to determine grades. Such standards are founded on basic concepts of integrity and honesty. These include, but are not limited to, the following areas:

1. Students shall not plagiarize
2. Students shall not cheat
3. Students shall not furnish materials or information in order to enable another student to plagiarize or cheat.

Instructors may deal with academic dishonesty in one or more of the following ways:

1. Assign an appropriate academic penalty such as an oral reprimand or point reduction.
2. Assign an "F" on all or part of a particular paper, project, or exam.
3. Report to the appropriate administrators, with notification of same to the student(s), for disciplinary action by the College. Such a report will be accompanied by supporting evidence and documentation.

Repeated violations may result in students receiving an "F" in the course, suspension or dismissal from the College.
